
### Vision for the CWP

## The CWP will be developed with County stakeholders




# The CWP will build upon local and regional planning efforts




# WATER PLAN

### The Development Team is responsible for producing outcomes



The Workgroups are responsible for drafting content

- Develop Content
  - Issue: Draft targets, strategies & actions
  - Program: Policies and informed stakeholder education pieces
- Work iteratively with stakeholder workshops and listening sessions
- Agencies with water management responsibility



### The Stakeholders are responsible for providing input

- Provide input on draft workgroup targets, strategies, and actions
- Prioritize content with subregional perspective
- Offer sub-regional perspective
- Review and provide feedback on draft CWP



### The CWP will leverage existing IRWM framework and relationships

- CWP stakeholder workshops will be at regularly scheduled IRWM meetings
  - Antelope Valley RWMG
  - Upper Santa Clara RWMP
  - ► 5 GLAC Subregions
  - ► GLAC LC RWMG
- CWP will build upon existing IRWM Plan goals, targets and project information



### The CWP development process is on-going



#### Step 1

Community-driven **Priorities** 

Use established community-driven priorities, needs & goals from public & interest groups.

Where we are today

#### Step 2

Stakeholder-driven Plan Development

Use stakeholder workshops to review, inform, vet, and prioritize CWP targets, strategies, and actions.

Spring-Fall 2021

#### Step 3

Comprehensive CWP Plan Review

Circle back to IRWM groups and public to get comprehensive input on draft plan

Spring 2022

#### Step 4

Collaborative *Implementation* 

**Establish partnership** pathways for future implementation
