WATER RESILIENCY SUMMIT

April 29, 2024





Chair of the LA County Board of Supervisors Lindsey P. Horvath convened the Water Resiliency Summit with key water visionaries and infrastructure leaders, along with other essential technical experts and engineers. academics, tribes, and environmental and communitybased organizations from throughout the County to discuss implementation of the LA County Water Plan (CWP) and launch its Task Forces. Over 200 water and community experts gathered at LA County Public Works Headquarters on April 29, 2024 for the Summit. The CWP is the first comprehensive planning document that articulates a shared, inclusive, regional path forward to sustainably and equitably achieve safe, clean, and reliable water resources for all LA County residents. The CWP was adopted unanimously by the LA County Board of Supervisors on December 5, 2023, and serves as a roadmap for water resilience in the County. Over the course of the day, panels shared expert views on CWP topics including water conservation and communication, regional water reliability, and nature-based solutions. A resource fair was held and offered educational information from CWP collaborators such as Water for LA, and Los Angeles Department of Water & Power. In the afternoon, four Task Force breakouts were held to kick off the process of working collaboratively to achieve the targets of the CWP. Moving forward, Task Forces will begin taking the steps outlined in the CWP 2-Year Action Plans.
